ahiri is an award-winning author and has achieved a quick international success. All her works deal with the themes of cultural identities and the nostalgia of the characters for homeland and the problems they face while living in America. In her works, she depicts the lives of Indians in exile, of people navigating between ethnic culture and tradition they have inherited and a baffling new world they must encounter everyday without any bias. Her themes include physical and emotional displacement, assimilation, loneliness, rootlessness, linguistic barriers, failed relationships, marital difficulties and misunderstandings. In an article 'My Two Lives' published in Newsweek, Lahiri admits that when her parents die, she will lose her connection to India: "Everything will change once they die. Without them, the back-and-forth life my family leads, both literally and figuratively, will at last approach stillness. An anchor will drop, and a line of connection will be severed."
